	All criteria in 1 must be met
1.	General Criteria
1.1	All instructional material, including teachers' manuals, films, tapes, or other supplementary instructional material, which will be used in connection with any research or experimentation program or project (see Footnote 1) will be available for inspection by the parents or guardians of the children (see Footnote 2) engaged in such research.(34 CFR §98.3)
1.2	No student will be required to submit without prior consent (see Footnote 3) to psychiatric examination, testing, or treatment, or psychological examination, testing, or treatment, (see Footnotes 4 and 5) in which the primary purpose is to reveal information concerning one or more of the following: (34 CFR §98.4) <ul> <li>Political affiliations</li> <li>Mental and psychological problems potentially embarrassing to the student or his or her family</li> <li>Sex behavior and attitudes</li> <li>Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating and demeaning behavior</li> <li>Critical appraisals of other individuals with whom the student has close family relationships</li> <li>Legally recognized privileged and analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers</li> <li>Income, other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under a program</li> </ul>

3.1	"Research or experimentation program or project" means any program or project in any research that is designed to explore or develop new or unproven teaching methods or techniques (34 CFR §98.3)
3.2	"Children" means persons enrolled in research not above the elementary or secondary education level, who have not reached the age of majority as determined under state law (34 CFR §98.3)
3.3	"Prior consent" means: (34 CFR §98.4) • Prior consent of the student, if the student is an adult or emancipated minor • Prior written consent of the parent or guardian, if the student is not an emancipated minor
3.4	"Psychiatric or psychologic examination or test" means a method of obtaining information, including a group activity, that is not directly related to academic instruction and that is designed to elicit information about attitudes, habits, traits, opinions, beliefs or feelings (34 CFR §98.4)
3.5	"Psychiatric or psychological treatment" means an activity involving the planned, systematic use of methods or techniques that are not directly related to academic instruction and that is designed to affect behavioral, emotional, or attitudinal characteristics of an individual or group (34 CFR §98.4)
